

Dorchester County Referendums

Re: Local Option Permit

The voters in Dorchester County have passed a county-wide referendum to allow the possession, sale, and consumption of alcoholic liquors by the drink on-premise in the county. This is also known as the Local Option Permit or **LOP**. The South Carolina Department of Revenue has approved the wording of the referendum and is **now accepting applications** for the receipt of the local option permit for those located in the **county limits of Dorchester**. The Department is asking the taxpayer to utilize the below-mentioned information in order to expedite the application for the LOP. The prerequisite for applying for, and submitting the application (along with additional requested items), is that the taxpayer must currently possess a valid, good-standing liquor by the drink license also known as a PLB and/or PLC.

- **A COMPLETED AND SIGNED ABL – 29 or ABL – 29A**
Individual Sundays - \$200 per Sunday (ABL - 29 form)
52 weeks for \$3,050.00 (ABL - 29A form)

- **COPY OF CURRENT BUSINESS LICENSE ISSUED BY THE COUNTY OF DORCHESTER OR A MUNICIPALITY LOCATED WITHIN THE COUNTY**

- **Immigration Documents (ABL-577 – for sole proprietors or an ABL-920 – other than sole proprietor) on EACH principal.**
Principal Types:
 - The owner (if sole proprietorship)
 - All officers of the business or entity, which owns the business
 - All partners
 - All persons who own 25% or more of the value of the business entity
 - All persons who own 25% or more of the combined voting power of the business or entity
 - Managers of LLC, which is managed, by managers
 - Members of LLC, which is not managed by managers
 - Any fiduciary who manages, controls title, or is otherwise in control of the business
 - All employees who will have day-to-day operational management responsibility for the business or entity
 - If a publicly traded corporation, the designated agent (over 21 years of age and SC resident)
 - All other principals must be listed also. If not publicly traded, all stockholders
 - If a nonprofit organization, all officers and directors of the organization

Re: 7-day Beer and Wine Permit

The voters in Dorchester County have passed a referendum to allow the sale of beer and wine at permitted off-premises locations without regard to days and hours of sales in the county. This is also known as the 7-day beer and wine permit (P7B). The South Carolina Department of Revenue has approved the wording of the referendum and is **now accepting applications** for the issuance of the seven-day beer and wine permit for those located in the County of Dorchester. The Department is asking the taxpayer to utilize the below-mentioned information in order to expedite the application for the P7B. The prerequisite for applying for, and submitting the application (along with additional requested items), is that the taxpayer must currently possess a valid, good-standing on/off-premise beer and wine permit also known as a PBG or PBW.

- **A COMPLETED, SIGNED, AND NOTARIZED ABL-901**
Including the **Consent and Waiver**.
Not Required: Newspaper receipt, Criminal History and Lease

- **ORIGINAL GREEN LICENSE (COPY IS UNACCEPTABLE)**

- **SIGNED ACKNOWLEDGEMENT 7-DAY OFF-PREMISE BEER AND WINE PERMIT** (see attached) (For PBW's Converting to P7B's ONLY)

- **COPY OF CURRENT BUSINESS LICENSE ISSUED BY THE COUNTY OF DORCHESTER OR FROM A MUNICIPALITY LOCATED WITHIN THE COUNTY OF DORCHESTER**

- **IMMIGRATION DOCUMENTS (ABL-577 – for sole proprietors or an ABL-920 – other than sole proprietor) on EACH principal.**
